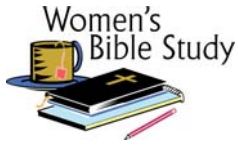


We welcomed **Ryker Mitchell

Missional Discovery Journey

What is the Missional Discovery Journey?

The Missional Discovery Journey (MDJ) is a program by the South-Central Synod of Wisconsin, ELCA and its New & Renewing Evangelizing Congregations Mission Table.

The MDJ is an eighteen month process designed to engage pastors and lay leaders in the Spirit-led development of a missional vision and practice for their congregations.

What MDJ is:

- A Focus on prayer, spiritual practices, and Bible study to discern God's purpose
- An equipping of leaders with the skills and knowledge to engage in God's mission
- An opportunity to meet with and learn from others exploring similar issues
- A way to help congregations to be who God has called them to be, see the resources with which God has blessed them and their community, and do what matters in Jesus' name
- A journey unique to each team, with its own timetable

What does "Missional" mean?

Being missional means continually asking the question, "**Where is God sending us?**"

Being missional means to be focused outward. It is to recognize that the church exists not for itself, but for the sake of the world and for the sake of God's mission to bless and heal the whole world. God has a purpose for us, and our goal is to discover how we can live out that purpose in our neighborhood, community and world.

How has this journey helped congregations?

"This has helped us come together as a team. Learning to go deeper spiritually and learning to discern God's word and then sharing that with each other!"

"The topics deal with real church issues... This has been a great experience!"

"We were stuck in a rut as a congregation and are now moving out of it."

"MDJ helped us become non-anxious leaders during change."

Program Design

- Five to eight congregations will participate.
- Each congregation will create a Missional Discovery Team (MDT) that includes the pastor(s) and four to seven lay leaders.
- The program includes six seminars, a six month time frame to contextualize your learning for your setting, and a wrap up gathering.
- Each MDT will be provided a trained coach to accompany their congregation on the journey.

Schedule

The next MDJ begins in January 2012.

Topics of Saturday Sessions:

- 1) *What Does It Mean to Be Missional?*
- 2) *Discipleship & Discernment*
- 3) *Adaptive Leadership: Leading Change*
- 4) *Systems Thinking: Encouraging Healthy Congregations*
- 5) *Hospitality: Creating Space for Others*
- 6) *Missional Context: Engaging Your Community*
- 7) *Sustaining the Mission*

The Saturday sessions will typically be held from 8:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. Specific dates for each session are to be determined. Locations of sessions typically rotate among participating congregations.

Registration Information:

The fee is \$1250 per congregation.

We are grateful for the support of the South-Central Synod of WI Endowment Fund to keep the congregational fees low. If a congregation needs financial assistance, scholarship funds may be available.

Pastor's Pen

"The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God."

Mark 1:1

Prepare. Anticipate. Hope. New. Life. The baby's room is painted. The closet filled with folded impeccably clean clothes. The "Diaper Genie" in its place. Swing, check. Baby bed, stroller, car seat – check, check and double check. All this for such a tiny one. For the beloved one. For the one yet unnamed.

Most of you already know that our youngest daughter and our son-in-law are expecting their first child in mid December. We are excited. Six years ago during Advent, this yet unborn and unnamed baby's cousin, Ava Marie arrived a few weeks early. Her birth coming thirteen months after a birth defect caused the death of Ava's older sister Isabella. After the loss of Isabella, there was much hoopla and celebration within the family. Still, the world barely noticed and continued along as if nothing had changed. Businesses and workers, schools and students, farmers and chores, shoppers and purchases, children at play, traffic and travelers, military, prophets, rulers and shepherds moved steadily on with their daily routines.

So very much of our life marches on with little anticipation of what is new and amazing. We prepare for Lord knows what. There is some hope in a return to pre-recession economic conditions. A return to normal conditions is to desire a better status quo. The human condition seeks stability. Seldom do we look to the past for something new. We want things to straighten out the future. Order, not chaos is our cry.

Christians hear anew in Advent the cry of one from the wilderness. He cries out for us to, "Prepare the way for one who is coming". The highways will be made straight. The mountains and the valleys will be made level. The future will be made new. Life will never be the same. Mercy and justice will rule over oppression and chaos. The lion shall lay down with the lamb. He shall be called, "Wonderful, counselor, the mighty God, the everlasting Father, Prince of peace".

Are you ready? Have you been preparing? If so, what are you making preparations for? The birth of God's

only Son. God coming to us, to you, in the flesh. Immanuel arrives in the typical way a child does, laboring from the womb. From that moment of Jesus' birth everything in the universe is forever altered. All creation groans in anticipation for all that is, and all that is yet to come.

I pray that you create time away from the busyness of your life to prepare for Jesus. For yourself, for your family may it be time to move away from the chaos of our crazy, self-oriented, consuming life into the old, old story of Jesus' love. That you may be transformed, changed from normal into a new creation because Jesus was born, lived, died and was resurrected for you. Can we be prepared for something so radically different than our typical Christmas preparations? Yes, through Christ.
