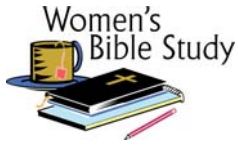

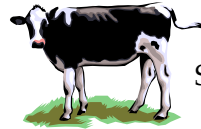
What: The task involves making contact with people to schedule them as a coffee host for a particular Sunday, and then give the list to Marcia in the church office.

The Practice of Meditation

Meditation is a practice that is thousands of years old. Most mystical religious groups practice meditation. This includes the monastic and mystical traditions in Christianity. Meditation is seen as a path that grants us experiential access to God. According to James Finley, meditation is an awakening to our eternal oneness with God; a way to be more awake, compassionate, Christlike human beings.

Thomas Merton said "to meditate is to exercise the mind in serious reflection."¹ But this reflection does not refer to a purely intellectual activity and it is not reasoning. It is a quest for truth; a truth that is difficult to discover if we do not quiet our minds and step back from the activity of the world around us.

For me, meditation has been an experience of a different reality than what I experienced before I meditated. It has been an awakening, a consciousness beyond what I think. It has also been a lesson in how my "thinking" affects my emotions and actions, and what I can do to calm my thoughts, stay in the present, and be open to the nudging of the Holy Spirit.

In June, I will be offering an opportunity to come and learn about some different types of meditation. We will explore Centering Prayer, Lectio Divina, Opening Prayer, Tonglen and Walking Meditation. It is not necessary to come to all of the sessions.

Pastor's Pen

"I was there to hear your borning cry, I'll be there when you are old.

I rejoiced the day you were baptized to see your life unfold." Borning Cry, ELW #732

The celebration of the "Affirmation of Baptism" happened last Sunday. It is commonly called "confirmation". Eight young people continued their life in the Lutheran Christian tradition with a public profession of their faith. Each was asked, "***Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism?***"

- to live among God's faithful people,
- to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
- and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Each one responded with the words, "***I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.***"

Then those present in the assembled congregation were asked, "***People of God, do you promise to support these sisters and brothers and pray for them in their life in Christ?***" They answered, "***We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.***"

The Holy Spirit of God will be active in the future lives of these young adults, changing them in ways yet unseen. There are changes coming for BLC, too. We followers are blessed that God acts through changes and also through constant faithfulness. God inspires creation to act upon those things that accomplish God's will. Though we wish it were not so, following confirmation, we are often given their "Farewell". We pray they will not be apart from Christ's body, the Church. Many will not participate within this faith community (or other communities) again. Our celebration of them becomes our grief by their absence from this community. Changes come

for them and for us. We hope and trust God is in their changes and trust that God holds their futures within God's redeeming plan. For blessing us with these young Christians, we give thanks to God! We pray them for them, "God Bless you and Godspeed".

We also begin teaching Intern Tamra, and learning from her, how to share with one another the necessary, "Farewell's". In about nine weeks (July 24th) her time with us ends. This change comes whether we are ready for it or not. A portion of our responsibility, as a teaching congregation, is to educate Tamra about how to act, in a good and healthy manner, when a (ministry) relationship comes to an end. Endings occur in all of our lives as individuals, as families, as students, as co-workers, etc.... An important learning about endings is to be intentional with planning for the various ways we may want or need to say "good-bye". It is vitally important, both for Tamra and for us, that we make choices of our personal (or family) method of saying "good-bye" to her. Share a "good-bye" that has meaning and value for you. Some examples might be: You invite her (or Ev and her) to your home for a meal, or for coffee and snacks. You could take Tamra, or Tamra & Ev, out for a meal, or a boat ride, or hiking, etc... You could make, or buy, and send a meaningful card. You might write a personal note or letter, or share a favorite CD of music, or share something that you alone can. Your farewell may be small gifts of food, etc.... Saying goodbye is very important! If you are unsure about what to do, or how to do this, please ask me or ask Tamra. In teaching healthy ways for an intern pastor to say goodbye to a congregation, Tamra will carry that learning wherever she will serve the Church in the future. I strongly suggest that you please not delay making arrangements. As with the last ten months, the next nine weeks will "fly by". We are blessed by Tamra. Let us offer our blessings to her and to Ev. "***We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.***"
